HOW TO FEST

Rule #1: Know where you are.

It's December in Anchorage, on Dena'ina land. Throw on your scarf, feel the bite of the cold. It makes you alive. It makes you present. Watch your step, watch out for black ice, and follow the glow of the theaters. Anchorage is a special place. You came for films worth freezing for.

Rule #2: Celebrate the mix.

AIFF is a collision of voices: films that have already roared through SXSW, Tribeca, and Sundance, alongside Alaskan filmmakers turning mountains, wilderness, and city streets into cinema, and Native voices woven throughout. The magic is in the variety.

Rule #3: Devour it.

This festival isn't meant to be sampled. Don't just see your own film. Don't drop in once and disappear. At any given time, there are always two films playing. That means you'll have options. Pick one, lean in, and stay for the conversations that follow.

Rule #4: Explore.

Each venue has its own rhythm: the legendary Bear Tooth, the Alaska Experience beside the Wildbirch Hotel, E Street downtown, and the Anchorage Museum. Together, they give the festival its texture. Meet people, and don't miss the 9am Coffee Talks, they are open to anyone who's attended even a single screening.

Rule #5: Remember why you're here.

You came for cinema. To celebrate the bold voices and wild ambition of filmmakers, and the stubborn love of independent film that keeps us gathering in the cold. Talk to the artists who brought their work here, strike up conversations in the lobby, and don't be shy about saying hi to us. Take photos. Make friends. There's no such thing as overdressing. Linger. Wander. Soak it all in. This is the 25th year of AIFF, worth every moment you give it.




